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Personal Statement

In medical school my biochemistry professor told me I should go into Internal Medicine because I did so well in his class. Fortunately, I did not listen to him and matched in Emergency Medicine. It was during my residency I discovered three mentors who were trained in medical toxicology. Through them I learned that clinical toxicology is a dynamic connection between microscopic mechanisms and macroscopic toxidromes, defined by the kinetic principles of the toxin.

Success in this field requires a fascination with the complexity of pharmacology, physiology and biochemistry and the patience and resiliency to troubleshoot the challenges of caring for often uncooperative patients combined with life-threatening effects. There is no greater satisfaction than assembling the clues surrounding these puzzling situations, recognizing the differential possibilities and administering an antidote that reverses the toxicity before your eyes. To reciprocate the fostering of my career, I felt compelled to demonstrate my gratitude by continuing on the path my predecessors forged, by sustaining excellence for the benefit of future clinical toxicologists and our patients. This led me to the American Academy of Clinical Toxicology (AACT).

Participation in AACT has provided me numerous opportunities to mix teaching, service and investigational research. As a speaker and organizer for symposia at the annual North American Congress of Clinical Toxicology (NACCT), I refined my skills as a teacher with an international audience. My interest in education must have been obvious, as I was asked to Chair the CME Committee for AACT. In this position, I learned a tremendous amount about providing quality, balanced, evidenced-based education for physicians in North America and Europe.

Through NACCT, I continued to develop research methods and writing skills by preparing and reviewing scientific abstracts and proposals for research grants.
